Significant Events

- **PW Administration:** Sent letters to affected food establishments and schools regarding the City's program to reduce Fats, Oils, & Grease (FOG) from entering the City's sewer collection system through food establishment waste pipelines. Continued development of a billing model to establish water rates for Outside (of the City boundaries) Culinary Water users.
- **Engineering Division:** Continued work on updates for the Sewer and Culinary Water master plans. The Library Park Parking Lot project is in construction (Johnston and Phillips, Inc.) with storm drain pipelines installed and the parking lot rough graded out. The 1900 East & 1700 East roadway reconstruction project was awarded to Johnston & Phillips. The 650 North Storm Drain Project was awarded to low bidder, Lyndon Jones Construction. The CUP Water Conservation Grant contract (\$9 million) was signed by the Mayor and submitted to the Central Utah Water Conservancy District for final execution.
- **Streets Division:** Replaced over 30 traffic signs. Hauled 800 cubic yards of gravel for upcoming chip seal projects. Completed an additional 12,000 linear feet of crack seal on 400 South to protect this major roadway. Repaired several sidewalk trip hazards, and road excavations throughout the City. Bid out roadway reconstruction projects on 1700 East (north of 400 South) and 1900 East (North of Canyon Road).
Solid Waste – 42 cans replaced, 27 new cans delivered, 5 additional cans picked up, 13 late cans; billed at \$3.00 for return pick up.
- **Water Division:** Water personnel responded to a broken water main call on the evening of Saturday, June 23rd, working through the night into Sunday to complete repairs. In order to isolate the leak, a large portion of the northeast side of Springville was without water into Sunday morning. Crews found a leaking service line, which was quickly repaired and the main placed back into service.
- **Wastewater Division:** Sewer Collections and Storm Drain personnel cleaned 8,616 linear feet of sewer main pipeline, spent 38 hours sweeping streets throughout the City, completed 90 hours of storm water mapping. Sold only 193 yards of compost (398 cubic yards were sold the previous month) to citizens. Repaired 5 manholes and 5 pipeline segments stopping water infiltration into the sewer system.
