

**Springville Arts Commission Minutes**  
**March 10, 2009**  
**Community Service Building**  
**443 South 200 East**

Delora Bertelsen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Present were Delora Bertelsen, Claudia Davenport, Chuck Keeler, Milt Jones, Glenn Alleman, Robinne Booth, Lou Ann Talcott, Donna Breckenridge, Dawn Jensen and Phil Bird. The invocation was given by Milt Jones.

Delora informed the group that Kolene Knight has submitted a letter of resignation. She asked everyone to collect articles for the commission history until a new Historian is found. Teddy Anderson has indicated she doesn't want to continue as a board member. She has not submitted a letter of resignation. Several possible replacements were suggested.

Minutes were read and corrected. Claudia Davenport made the motion to accept the minutes. Donna Breckenridge seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Delora asked all members to look at the By-laws and suggest any changes or updates that need to be made. Councilman Phil Bird reported on the Villa Theater. A budget of \$41,000.00 for up grades and \$87,000.00 for furniture will be proposed for the next fiscal year starting in July. The proposed budget would also create a position for a part time manager. He also reported that the City Hall is on schedule and under budget at this time. The Fire Station will officially open at Art City Days.

Charles Keeler gave a presentation on the proposed Facility Use Policy and the formation of a Facility Use Committee. He asked members of the commission to take the policy home and think about it. If you have any ideas or need clarification call Delora, Chuck, or Phil.

### **Commission Reports**

**Historical Society:** Glenn Alleman reported that the last meeting's lecture on Porter Rockwell was wonderful. The next meeting will be April 22. Linda Carter will do a presentation on Orphans. The meetings usually last an hour. Glen expressed appreciation to the Springville Museum of Art for the use of the meeting room.

**Arts in Education:** Donna Breckenridge has received a thank you note from Nikki Fullmer for the \$300.00 grant to Merit Academy's dance program. She also received a thank you note from the Springville Mapleton Reflections program.

**Springville Folkfest:** Donna Breckenridge has received letters of confirmation from dance groups from Korea, Mexico, India, Hungary, Czech Republic, Belgium, and Poland. There is also a French group that dances in wooden shoes that may be coming. They are also working with Bountiful to help get Visa for Romania, China, Algeria, Turkey, South Africa, Ukraine, Nepal and a Russian Cossack group.

**Music, Concert Series and Talent Show:** Milt Jones reported that the auditions for the Talent Festival will be held upstairs at the Springville Museum of Art April 18. The Talent Festival will be held on June 6.

The Sunday Concerts at the Museum are well attended. Clint Crawford will perform on March 15. Christopher Holmes, a baritone will perform April 19.

**Performing Arts:** Robinne Booth reported that the play See How They Run started February 27 and will run to March 21. Performances are Monday Friday and Saturday at 7:30 p.m. Auditions for the musical Pajama Game will be held March 18 and 19 from 7:00 till 10:00. Pajama Game will run during Art City Days from June 5 to June 27. She asked members to suggest plays they would like to see for next season.

**Library:** Claudia Davenport showed books purchased for Project Read with an Arts Commission grant. Each book has a paper inside indicating that it was purchased with money donated by the Springville Arts Commission. She encouraged members to attend the Public Forum about the new library. It will be at 7:00 Thursday March 12.

**Graphic Arts and Museum:** Dawn Jensen reported that 356 people attended that awards ceremony for The High School Show. Congressman Chavez presented the awards. She passed out High School Show programs and also a schedule of Museum events. Dawn indicated that plans for The Arts Ball are underway.

**Dance:** No report.

**Publicity:** No report.

**Statues to Live By:** It was suggested that Nancy Caulkin might give assistance on statue placement for the City Hall Block. She is a landscape architect. An anonymous donor has donated a statue to The Museum. They in turn donated it to the Arts Commission. It will be placed at the Arts Park.
