

**Springville Arts Commission Minutes**  
**June 9, 2009**  
**Community Service Building**  
**443 South 200 East**

Delora Bertelsen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Present were Donna Breckenridge, Milt Jones, Robinne Booth, Glenn Alleman, Claudia Davenport, Dawn Jensen, Lou Ann Talcott, Chuck Keeler, Delora Bertelsen, and Phil Bird. Robinne Booth gave the invocation

There was no public comment. The minutes from the May 12, 2009 meeting were read, and corrections were made. Milt Jones made the motion to accept the minutes as amended. Donna Breckenridge seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Delora informed the group that Christie Babbitt has resigned from The Commission. We are now looking for a Historian, a person to represent dance and one for publicity.

She also reminded everyone that if you receive money from the Springville Arts Commission, you need to recognize The Commission as a donor in any publicity, program, etc.

**Commission Reports.**

**Historical Society:** Glenn Alleman said they have completed the lecture series for this year. The final lecture was by Gloria Barnett on the history of Payson. He thanked The Museum for the use of the facility. He read a 1923 teacher's contract for Springville schools. It was humorous. Delora asked Chuck Keeler to talk to the DUP about moving and using the Historical Society's shelves at the Carnegie Building.

**Arts in Education:** Donna Breckenridge shared a "thank you" letter from Angel Pierce from Art City Elementary. She included pictures of their production. Donna also had an evaluation with pictures from the Cherry Creek Elementary project.

**Folkfest:** Donna Breckenridge reported the Ukraine were not able to obtain Visa's and won't be able to participate. Poland Hungary, Korea, Mexico, Belgium, India, and Romania are coming. We also have local groups, Morning Star, Voice Polynesia, and Rocky Mountain Express. The Folkfest Committee has started the P-3 Visa process for groups from China and Nepal for next year. Rocky Mountain Express's Bass player will share his instrument with the Hungarian group. The committee is beginning the process of finding housing for the participants.

**Music/Talent Show:** Milt Jones said the talent show was a great success. It lasted just under two hours. There will be no concert at The Museum in June.

**Performing Arts:** Robinne Booth reported The Pajama Game will perform Monday Friday and Saturday. The performance time is 7:30 and the final show is June 27. They have had good crowds so far. They had try outs for the children's production of 1001 Dalmations. 94 children tried out. Jill Bell is in charge of this production. David Hatch is doing a drama workshop in

conjunction with the production. They also are planning to do the play Harvey in the Fall.

**Library:** Claudia Davenport reported The Teddy Bear Tea had over 500 participants this year. They are doing a Summer Reading program with adults as well as with children. They have Summer reading bingo cards for adults and teen who participate. There is a special reading contract for children. When the cards are completed they can be turned in to enter in a drawing and they will be eligible to participate in a End of Summer Reading Party.

**Dance:** Delora asked Councilman Phil Bird if he would contact Chris Ollerton about being our representative for dance. She also informed the group The Pioneer Legacy will perform in Provo this year so Arts Commission funding will not apply to them.

**Graphic Arts / The Museum:** Dawn Jensen said they had over 100 volunteer lined up for the Children's Art Festival on Friday. They have a backup plan in case of rain.

The sculpture garden will be dedicated on July 6, 2009 by Dallin Oaks. Tickets are free but will be necessary to attend the dedication ceremony. She said the Spring Solon is beautiful and encouraged anyone who hasn't seen it to do so. She also passed out copies of The Museum's new brochure.

**Publicity:** Chrisi Babbit has resigned and we are looking for a replacement.

**City Report:** Councilman Phil Bird said the Fire Station will be officially opened on Thursday. The community is invited to breakfast and to view the new facility. The Administration building is on target and will be complete in July. They are fine tuning the floor plan for the new library. It will be a two story building. Once the plan is finalized it will go to an architect. The building will be started either late this Fall, or in the Spring of 2010.

There is no change on the Villa Theater project. Possible people to help on the project were discussed. Dan Hartley, the State Architect, and Nancy Caulkin were suggested as resources. There will be about \$2000.00 left in the Art Commission budget. It was suggested that it be used toward a study on the Villa.

Nancy Caulkin is also willing to be involved in the design of the sculpture garden at The City Office Building. Bob Fraizer was also suggested as a professional design resource for that project.

Delora reminded that group that all bills needed to be handed in to Chuck before the end of June.

Donna Breckenridge moved to adjourn the meeting and Dawn Jensen seconded the motion. The motion carried.
