

2017 Springville Citizen Survey





Snow Removal, Plowing and Garbage Cans



During the winter months, it is important for Springville residents and the City to work together during snow removal weather. During heavy snow

storms, it can take up to 48-hours to clear all the priority routes and through streets once the storm has subsided. Parking is restricted on designated streets (snow route) between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am from November 1 through March 31. Designated streets and more information on snow removal can be found on the City's website at springville.org/public-works/snowremoval. We also ask that you place your garbage can in the street, away from the gutter and out of the snow during the winter months. When the garbage can is on or behind a snow berm, it is difficult for the garbage truck to reach it and pick it up.

Curbside Christmas Tree Pickup

The Street's Department will be picking up live Christmas trees (weather permitting) January 02-15, 2018. Please have all lights and decorations removed and place tree along the curb in a visible location. Trees will be used



for composting. Residents may also take live trees, minus decorations to the Yard Waste Facility at 600 W. 700 N. Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
