

Pay Attention to Storm Water this Summer



What goes in the gutter, goes to the lake. Are you contributing to the Utah Lake Hazardous Algae Bloom each year?

Two of Summer's favorite activities, yard work and washing your car, can be harmful to the Springville City Storm water System. Storm water does not get treated before it heads for the lake, like the water that enters the sewer system. Foamy car suds, lawn cuttings and excess fertilizer go straight to Utah Lake. heraldextra.com/news/local/no-easy-solutions-to-algae-blooms-on-utah-lake

Here are some guidelines to do your part to avoid large increases in future spending to protect Utah Lake from excessive phosphorus that cause algae blooms.

- Use commercial car washes where the dirty water goes to the wastewater treatment plant, not straight to the lake.
- Reduce the need for lawn fertilizer by frequently mowing your lawn with a mulching mower and leaving the trimmings on the lawn.
- Use compost and soil amendments instead of fertilizer.
- If you do fertilize, use slow release fertilizer with the word "WIN" on the label. This indicates that the fertilizer contains water insoluble nitrogen.

Construction Continues on 400 South at I-15



Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) is widening 400 South to five lanes from Interstate 15 (I-15) to 2600 West. Sidewalk, curb, gutter and drainage improvements as well as an 8' sound wall adjacent to the residences on the south side of the road are included in this project. Another eastbound to northbound turn lane at the 400 S. interchange will be added and on ramps to I-15 will be widened to improve traffic flow.

2018 Fireworks Restrictions



Fireworks use is prohibited in the foothills area and around brush covered or dry grass areas. See map on the City [website](#) for details.

This year the State of Utah has reduced the days for fireworks use. Fireworks are only permitted to be used on July 2nd through 5th and July 22nd through 25th. Fireworks hours are 11am until 11pm, except on July 4th and 24th when the ending time is midnight.

A new State law has increased the penalty for starting a fire by fireworks. The fine is up to \$1,000.00 and you may be charged for the cost of firefighting and damage caused by the fire. If the individual who starts the fire is a minor, a parent may be liable for the costs.

Use of illegal fireworks will result in a fine. The Fire Department encourages all residents to discharge fireworks in safe and legal areas. Help keep Springville safe!
