WAYNE BARTHOLOMEW FAMILY PARK POLICY

Springville City operates and maintains the Wayne Bartholomew Family Park. Located within the park are pavilions, a beach, restroom, concession operations, open grass areas, and a pond for fishing that are all available for the public to enjoy. To learn about policy for loud music, curfew, service animals or dogs in general, go online to springville.org/buildings-and-grounds/city-parks/bartholomew/bartholomew-park-regulations-2/. All park patrons will be expected to conform to all posted city park ordinances, rules, guidelines, and standards. Some examples are:

- No fishing allowed on beach area. Fish may not be field dressed in the park. Fish entrails, or other body parts of the fish, may not be disposed of in the water or the park.
- Open fires, dutch ovens, barbeques, any device with natural gas and/or propane, or anything of the like, are not allowed on the park property.
- No food is allowed on the water. Glass bottles of any kind are not allowed in the park, on the beach, or on the water.
- Canopies are not allowed on the beach. Small sport umbrellas 60 inches or less in size are allowed on the beach.
- Trailers cannot be parked on the main parking lot and those pulling a trailer must use the upper parking lot along Canyon Road.
- All patron parking for the park must have a visible displayed parking pass or a paid parking fee receipt to park in the parking areas.
- Fees for reservations will be set forth in the city's fee schedule and approved by the City Council. The fee schedule can be found on line at springville.org/utility-services/files/2018/11/2018-2019FeeSchedule.pdf
- Patrons are responsible to pick up and remove all of their trash. Trash should be placed in the provided garbage containers or hauled away from the park.
- No smoking or alcohol on the park premise.
- No weapons or guns are allowed on the premises unless authorized by the city/state.

PARKING PASSES

Parking Passes are available at the Civic Center cashier windows, Clyde Recreation Center, and the Community Service Building. None of the staff



at those locations can deviate from written policy. If you have an issue you may address your concern in writing to Bradley Neel at bneel@springville.org

Passes are available beginning April 1st of each year and are in affect from May 1st – September 30th

Resident and patron parking at the park from October 1st – April 30th doesn't require a pass.

ONE parking pass per household/business. No printing at home. Springville resident second vehicle must follow outside of city limit rules. If a pass is lost or misplaced a person may request another in writing to hpenni@springville.org or bneel@springville.org

PASS ELIGIBILITY

SPRINGVILLE RESIDENT/ HOMEOWNER:

One who lives within Springville City city limit boundaries and pays property taxes to Springville City. OR, one who lives within Springville City boundaries and occupies a rental property from a landlord.

LANDLORD OF RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY:

One who may or may not live in Springville City boundaries but pays property taxes to the City. Landlord is entitled to ONE pass regardless of number of dwellings owned.

BUSINESS OWNER

A business located in Springville City limits, and the building is owned by the business owner/landlord who in turn pays property taxes to the City. Must provide proof of ownership.

VALIDATION/PROOF OF RESIDENCE

Bring a photo ID **WITH** utility bill, property tax statement, current month credit card/cell phone billing showing name and address.

A special message to the residents of Springville: "The Springville Museum of Art is your museum!" Over the past few years museum staff and donors have been focusing on wonderful programs especially created with the children and families of our city in mind. We create events and exhibitions directed to a variety of interests and age groups. With a little background on the types of exhibitions held during the year, we hope you can find something that reminds you why it is so great to have an art museum right within our city and why you should come and visit more often.

Juried Exhibitions

Throughout the year we have a series of competition or "juried" shows in which the works of art are often for sale. These traditional exhibitions take place on our main level and fill almost all of that space with unique pieces created by Utah's current practicing artists. We encourage community members to have an original work acquired in Utah's original Art City venue. The year started with the 47th Annual All-State High School Art Show with works of art coming from promising juniors and seniors in Utah's schools. This year we had 100 schools represented, including art of all styles, mediums, and sizes. You might even know of few of the students who were in the show. Over the course of the year we will also celebrate the big "signature" show the 95th Annual Spring Salon with artists from around the State sharing their most current works. This is an inspiring collection of art that always includes something new and exciting. Our entry numbers are among the highest of any juried show in the state, now nearing 1000 entries. Summer days bring the Annual Utah Quilt Show (this year will be the 46th) where some of the top and most creative quilters around share their work with the rest of the community. Come and get ideas or even buy a quilt. Then the year will wrap up in the fall with our 34th Annual Spiritual & Religious Art of Utah exhibition which celebrates the diversity of our beliefs and religious traditions. It's a wonderful opportunity to look at how much we have in common as community members and ways in which we celebrate harmonious interactions.

Permanent Collection Exhibitions

The Springville Museum of Art's Permanent Collection of Utah art is the finest in the state—begun in 1903 by our local high school students and community members. Works from this collection (owned by the Art Association as a non-profit 501(c)3) are on display year round. Come and find your favorites and learn more about this important history which led to the moniker "Utah's Art City." We also have a fascinating collection of Russian art that surprises and dazzles visitors from around and outside the State.

Temporary "Curated" Exhibitions

A curated exhibition is one that is planned with a special message or theme in mind and includes a variety of artworks. These exhibitions are usually placed throughout the upper and lower level galleries. We invite Utah artists to participate according to their various content and styles. We often combine contemporary pieces with those from the Permanent Collection to show off Utah's best artists and their ideas over the years.

Installing these exhibitions entail about 29,000 moves of objects of all types and sizes. Kudos to the museum staff who work so hard and a hearty "Welcome" to all you to come and visit!
