#### CALL TO ORDER

#### APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

#### COMMITTEE BUSINESS

1. PARKS & RECREATION BOARD TRAINING-table until next month.
2. PARK DEVELOPMENT
  - a. Community Park- no money in this year's budget for community park. Focus of council now is to maintain what we already have.
  - b. Cherrington Park- not on the radar now.
  - c. Dog Park- city council is still getting used to the idea of a dog park. Councilman Chris Creer recommended that if people talk to board members about wanting a dog park to instruct them to contact the city council with their request. Email is a good way to contact them.
3. GRANTS- Tiffany Haveron has been trying to chase down money from grants for playgrounds and parks. Lynn Bartholomew suggested looking into the Land and Water Conservation Fund.
4. CITY TRAILS PLAN AND MAP- Bradley Neel explained that there is a City plan that they want to add to and enhance. Focus is on trails close to schools and the Clyde Recreation Center. Possibly add bike lanes that are separate from the trail system. Tie in our trails with Mapleton trails. Springville Buildings and Grounds, Community Development and Public Works departments are working together on this project.

5. Arbor Day program will be at Art City School on April 26<sup>th</sup>. Smokey Bear will be coming again and 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders will help plant some trees. City tree policy is being updated. Tiffany reported that a few people have requested planting a tree in honor of someone. Instead of planting tree in new area, they can plant where there is stump from a previous tree that has been removed. These trees would be purchased by the individual that wants to plant the memorial tree. City's cost would be labor only. Trees at Wayne Bartholomew Family Park are being replaced because they were under warranty. Someone wanted to attach a plaque to a tree trunk. That would damage the tree.

Canyon Parks open on April 19<sup>th</sup>. Cemeteries are preparing for Mother's Day and Memorial Day. Restrooms in City parks will open on April 15<sup>th</sup>.
