2019 MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION DATES AND DEADLINES

- October 7, 2019: Last day to mail a paper voter registration form.
- October 15, 2019: Mail ballots are sent to voters.
- October 22, 2019: In-person early voting begins. Voters may register to vote with a provisional ballot at an early polling location. Early voting may not be available in certain municipalities. Visit vote.utah.gov to find early voting locations.
- October 29, 2019: Last day to request a mail ballot and register to vote on-line or at the county clerk's office.
- November 1, 2019: In-person early voting ends.
- November 5, 2019: Municipal General Election. Voters may register to vote with a provisional ballot at a polling location.

NEW DRIVE UP BALLOT DROP BOX

The City of Springville has installed a drive-up ballot drop box at the Springville Civic Center for your convenience. It is located at 110 South Main Street on the south side of the Civic Center next to the utility drop box facing West.



The drop box will be checked and emptied daily during election season. You can drop off your ballots from the convenience of your vehicle, up until the close of Election Day, November 05, 2019 at 8:00 p.m.

VOTE BY MAIL INFORMATION

The 2019 elections will be conducted using vote by mail. Registered voters are not required to fill out an application for the vote by mail ballot.

Each registered voter will be mailed a ballot and instructions for returning the ballot. Ballots are mailed no sooner than 21 days and no later than 14 days before an election. You may return your voted ballot in the following ways:

- Mail your ballot, postmarked no later than the day before the election.
- Drop off your ballot at any voter service center in the county.

YOUTH WRESTLING

For ages 4 through 6th Grade (must be 4 by Oct 1st). Registration deadline is October 11th. The \$45 fee includes a team shirt. Participant must provide own singlet (optional but recommended). Late fee of \$10 after the deadline, non-Springville residents add \$10. VOLUNTEER COACHES ARE NEEDED! Parents please volunteer with registration at springville.org/recreation/wrestling.



YOUTH BASKETBALL

Registration for 3rd-8th grade girls and boys is October 1st through October 31st for the upcoming 2020 playing season. Leagues are determined by school grade. Practices begin in late November and games are played January and February of 2020. The cost is \$45 per player. A \$10 late fee is added after the registration deadline. Non-Springville residents add \$10. The 3-4-5-6 grade boys will all play in separate leagues with their own grade. Team placements will be held in November, placement and are listed on the website and on registration receipts.

There are NO REQUESTS in a sport with placements (except siblings playing in the same league). Players will be drafted by the coach. The [Draft Policy](#) is available on the Recreation department page on the city website.

Pre-K to 2nd Grade Winter Session 2 – Registration is October 14 through November 15. Introductory league for boys and girls (Pre-K must be at least age 4 by January 1st). Scheduled games will include team practice time followed by a scrimmage with another team. Winter Session plays during January & February. Cost is \$40 per player. Non-Springville residents add \$10.

HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL 9TH-12TH GRADES

Registration is October 15 through November 15. Create your own team with friends. Cost is \$450 per team. Jerseys are included. Boys have a 7 player minimum and 10 player maximum per team. Must sign up as a team, all players MUST be listed on the roster. Schedules include play with other south Utah County teams. Leagues are divided by grade: Girls 9-12, Boys 9-10, and Boys 11-12. ADULT MEN'S BASKETBALL

Registration is October 1st through November 1st. Age 18 and up. Create a team with friends and co-workers. Team fee is \$600 for a nine player roster, plus \$30 for each additional player.



All teams play a 10 to 12 game season followed by the Nebo Tournament. Team captain can register and pay team fee on-line, then invite players by email address to join the team, or bring a completed team roster to the Recreation office at 443 South 200 East.
