DEEP FRIED TURKEY MISTAKES

Holidays are a wonderful time to spend with family, and not worry about the hustle and bustle of everyday life. Maybe you didn't get enough turkey on Thanksgiving and you're hankerin' for more. It is important to keep safety in mind when getting ready to cook the big, fat turkey.

A popular craze that people enjoy is deep frying their turkeys. While this is a delicious alternative to the traditional oven roasted turkey, it can also be very dangerous if not performed correctly. Springville Fire and Rescue would like to remind you about a few important considerations to keep in mind before dunking your bird in that hot oil.

First, and foremost it is very important to make sure that you set up your burner and pot of oil away from any structures (25 ft) or other flammable objects. Avoid setting it up on decks, patios, porches, garages or sheds as well as under awnings or other overhanging objects.

Another common mistake is over filling the pot with oil. Most commercially made pots have a max fill line marked on the pot. It's there for a reason. So make sure you are aware of how much oil you are adding, and don't let the oil get too hot. Follow the recommended guidelines and use a thermometer, instead of just guessing.

It's the day of your dinner party, and you realize that your 20 pound bird is not thawed and now dinner is delayed! Haven't we all been there? What usually happens is we throw the unthawed turkey in the oven, cook it a little longer, and just hope it works out. However, this is something that cannot happen when deep frying a turkey. It is extremely important to make sure that the turkey is completely thawed! Also, make sure that any water and other moisture has been completely wiped off and the turkey is dry. Hot oil and water do not mix! If the turkey still has any moisture, it can cause a violent reaction, and spill oil over the side of the pot, which will be ignited by the burner.

Lastly, do not leave your frying bird unattended. Make sure a responsible adult is always nearby watching your pot and burner. Do not allow children and pets in the cooking area, and have a fire extinguisher nearby.

This is not meant to scare people away from deep frying a turkey. It is meant to inform you of the possible dangers that exist if the deep frying is not done correctly. This website, themanual.com/food-and-drink/how-to-deep-fry-turkey, offers more information and guidelines that you can follow to make sure you have a safe deep frying experience.

Above all, Springville Fire and Rescue wants you to have a happy, safe, and fire free holiday!





TIME TO SIGN UP FOR XPRESS PAY

Springville City offers on-line payments to our residents through Xpress Bill Pay. This is a secure payment service that you can automate from home. You can see current and past statements, set up auto-pay, manage your account, receive information emails and receipts, and go paperless.



Here are some frequently asked questions and answers:

Q: Does it cost anything to sign up for on-line bill payment?

A: No. It's free to sign up for on-line bill payment and to use the Xpress Bill Pay service.

Q: How do I create a new login account?

A: From the Xpress Bill Pay home page, just click on the "GO" button below "Start Paying Bills Now." This will take you to the Account Setup page, where you simply provide some contact information and choose a password. Once you've created your Xpress Bill Pay login account, you can log in to start managing your billing accounts.

Q: Do I need a separate Xpress Bill Pay login for each billing account?

A: No. You can manage all your merchant and service provider billing accounts from a single Xpress Bill Pay login.

Q: What payment choices do I have?

A: You can typically pay your bills with a credit card, debit card, or you can transfer funds directly from your banking account using electronic funds transfer (EFT).

Q: Do you offer automatic bill payment?

A: Yes. When you set up your account you can choose automatic bill payment, so you don't need to do anything to pay your bills. Payment is automatically deducted from the credit card or banking account you specify, on the day of the month you choose.

Q: What other information is available?

A: You can view a year's history of your account on-line, so you can print and compare your current bill to previous bills.

Q: How do I update my customer information, such as email address or phone number?

A: Log in to your account, then click on "Edit Contact Information". You can then change your customer information as well as your login information.

Q: Is my information safe?

A: Absolutely. All the transactions are handled on secure servers and all sensitive data encrypted. As long as you don't give out your password, only you will be able to access your account. Plus, your personal information or e-mail address will NOT be sold or rented to third parties for marketing purposes without your permission.

Q: Can I pay my bills from my computer or smart phone?

A: You can pay your bill from any computer located in the US or Canada. All you need is internet access using any web browser. Log in to your account using your e-mail address and password. Because you can pay when you are away from home, there is no need to worry about late payments when you're out of town and your bill is due.

Q: How do I know the payment went through?

A: After you complete the transaction, you can receive an e-mail receipt to confirm your payment transaction.
