


2020 CENSUS

In mid-March, homes across the country will begin receiving invitations to complete the 2020 Census. The best way to avoid a visit from a census taker is to fill out the 2020 Census questionnaire online, by phone, or by mail as soon as you receive your invitation to participate. It is important to know that the Census Bureau will not send unsolicited emails to request your participation in the 2020 Census.



WHO IS REQUIRED TO RESPOND?

Everyone living in the 50 states, District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories (Puerto Rico, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands) is required by law to be counted in the 2020 Census.

HOW DO I VERIFY A CENSUS WORKER?

Census takers will visit homes in April to conduct quality check interviews, and then in mid-May to help collect responses.

If someone visits your home to collect information for the 2020 Census, check to make sure that they have a valid ID badge, with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date.

DURING THE 2020 CENSUS, THE CENSUS BUREAU WILL NEVER ASK FOR:

- YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER
- YOUR BANK ACCOUNT OR CREDIT CARD NUMBERS
- MONEY OR DONATIONS

IN ADDITION, THE CENSUS BUREAU WILL NOT CONTACT YOU ON BEHALF OF A POLITICAL PARTY.

Census workers may also carry Census Bureau bags and other equipment with the Census Bureau logo. If you still have questions about their identity you can call 800.923.8282 to speak with a local Census Bureau representative.

SHAPING YOUR FUTURE

The results of the 2020 Census will help determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding flow into communities every year for the next decade. That funding shapes many different aspects of every community, no matter the size, no matter the location.

The Yard Waste Facility, located at 600 West 700 North, opens March 3, 2020. Hours are Tuesday through Saturday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; closed Sundays & holidays. This is a free service to Springville residents, just bring a photo ID with your Springville address.

Non-residents and commercial operations will be charged to drop off their yard waste.

COMPOST SEASON

Composted materials suitable for soil enhancement are available for purchase (cash or check only) at \$25.00 per cubic yard, \$13.00 per 1/2 cubic yard for residents; \$36.00 per cubic yard, \$18.00 per 1/2 cubic yard for non-residents.

FEMA PUBLIC MEETING— FINAL FLOOD ELEVATION DETERMINATION



On December 19, 2019, Springville City received final flood elevation determination information (with respect to Hobble Creek and Utah Lake) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), United States Department of Homeland Security.

The flood elevation determination becomes effective on June 19, 2020, and has implications to property owners who are located within the newly established floodplain and floodway.

A map showing the newly established floodplain and floodway can be found at maps.springville.org/floodchange.

The Floodplain Manager for the Utah Division of Emergency Management will be holding a public meeting to discuss how this determination affects property owners in Springville. This meeting will be held on March 17, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. at the Springville Civic Center, in the multi-purpose room at 110 South Main Street.

If your property is located within Zone A (1-percent-annual-chance) floodplain delineated by FEMA, you will be required to purchase flood insurance. Please plan to attend the meeting.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION DAY

Utah County residents with household hazardous waste items such as old gasoline, paint, fluorescent light bulbs, batteries and unused medications will be offered safe disposal of these items at a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, April 11, 2020 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The collection will take place in the west parking lot of the Provo Towne Centre Mall in Provo. HISTORIC PRESERVATION

The Springville Historic Preservation Commission will be providing small grants to assist home and building owners in protecting and restoring the exterior of their building for the 2020–2021 year. The grant is for projects that contribute to the historic look and feel of the building and must be visible from the street. To qualify, a building must be on the National Register of Historic Places or located within the Springville National Historic District. In addition, it must be at least 50 years old and considered a 'contributing' building.

The grant can only be used for work on the exterior of the building and must be used on elements of the building that are at least 50 years old. It cannot be used for landscaping or on building additions that are less than 50 years old.

- Spring Session 2 – Registration is open March 2, 2020 through April 3, 2020 or until filled for girls and boys ages 6 through 13. Held on Wednesday evenings for a total of six weeks.
- Spring Session 3 **ADAPTIVE** – Registration is open March 2, 2020 through April 3, 2020 or until filled. For special needs people age 6 to adult. Held on Tuesday evenings for a total of six weeks.
