COMMITTEE BUSINESS

a. 5K – CelebrARTE – Rodeo June 5

The Chalk Festival is postponed to the fall at the request of City Administration.

The CelebrARTE event will be held from 3:00 pm to 8:00 pm at Arts Park.

The Virtual 5K Run for Fun information is finalized and posted to the website.

b. Movie – Contests – Book Sale – Gallery – Pioneer Museum June 7-12

The movie selections for this year have been ordered. The summer series will begin during Art City Days with the live action version of The Lion King.

Contest planning is moving forward as usual. Where's Corey contest will be changed so that Corey will only give out prizes at certain times during specific events. The instructions will be posted online.

Lisa will finalize whether the Book Sale will open on Tuesday evening.

Brown Gallery and the Pioneer Museum will both be open with free admission to the public during the week of Art City Days.

c. Carnival and Booths June 9-12

The configuration for these events will be the same as in previous years. The big hurdle will be getting a mass gathering permit with the current guidelines. Hopefully the restrictions will change and be opening up soon.

d. Fun-A-Rama – Battle of the Bands – 3-on-3 Basketball June 10

The magician has been hired and is set to perform at Fun-A-Rama.

Pascal at Mountain Rock Music is ready to sponsor and facilitate Battle of the Bands as he has in past years. If Covid-19 restrictions don't change, there's a possibility of moving this event to the Arts Park.

The 3-on-3 Basketball registration is open and available through Rec1. The rules and other information is posted online.

e. Balloon Fest and Balloon Glow June 11-12

Shelena reported that they are down to 13 pilots, which is still very good. She verified that there will be grids painted on the ground for the pilots to set up in specific areas. Pilots will need to enter a certain way to avoid driving over sprinkler pipes, but it will be okay without a board on the grass to protect it.

f. Fireman's Breakfast June 11-12

Warren informed the committee that Saturday, June 12 will be the only day of the Fireman's Breakfast event.

g. Children's Parade June 11

Mountainland has approved holding it at their newly acquired building and they are excited. Warren will plan for the officers needed to block 400 East during this parade.

h. Children's Art Fest June 11

Daniel and Leslie reported via email that the planning for this event is moving forward. They were unable to attend tonight due to another meeting being held at the Museum.

i. Talent Fest June 11

Auditions went well, this will be a good show. The planning for this event is moving forward as usual.

j. Grand Parade June 12

Both announcers have confirmed to come and participate. Entries are still being received at a regular pace and will definitely increase as it gets closer.

k. Regatta June 12

Patrick will schedule a time to get the cardboard. There should already be duct tape but we can check the inventory.

l. Concert & Fireworks June 12

This year's musical group will be The Sensations Show Band and a tribute to Abba. They perform a variety of music and will put an emphasis on playing Abba and hits from that era. It's a very family friendly show and this group is local so it saves on the budget.

m. Additional Discussion Items
